

It began with a walk, a bridge, and a dream.

On a quiet day in Belleville, artist and educator Emebet looked across the water and saw something more than just concrete and steel. She saw potential. She saw colour. She saw a connection.

"I was walking near the Bay Bridge and just thought—what if it could be wrapped in crochet?" she says, laughing. "I didn't even crochet at the time. But I knew I wanted to do something that would bring people together."

That spark of imagination became the foundation for Bridging Communities, one of the most heartfelt and inclusive public art projects the region has seen in years. The vision? To cover the Upper Front Street pedestrian bridge in crocheted panels made by people of all ages, backgrounds, and skill levels—from local students and seniors to fibre artists and first-timers across the globe.

"It's not about how perfect the stitch is. It's about the people behind them," says Emebet. "Crocheting reminds me of sitting with my sister and my mother when I was little. It's slow, comforting work—and it's meant to be shared."

Since launching the initiative in early 2023 with support from the Ontario Arts Council and the City of Belleville, Emebet has led community workshops, school programs, and drop-in crochet circles across the Bay of Quinte region. Over 200 students have already learned to crochet through her school visits, and dozens of adults now gather regularly to stitch, share stories, and find connections in yarn and conversation.

A Safe Space to Learn, Try, and Belong

The crochet circles aren't classes in the traditional sense. They're open, judgement-free spaces where anyone can join in. No experience is required, and all materials—yarn, hooks, even encouragement—are provided.

"If you've never crocheted before, we'll teach you," says Emebet. "If you've tried and think you're not good enough, come anyway. We're not here to be perfect. We're here to create something together."

That spirit of togetherness is central to every part of the project.

From the County Arts Lab in Picton to the Quinte West Community Health Centre in Trenton, Quinte Arts Council in Belleville, and even in libraries and galleries in Kingston, her crochet circles are becoming regular gatherings—places where people from all walks of life come to stitch and stay awhile.

"Some people come for the art. Some come for the social connection. Some come just to try something new," she says. "But no matter the reason, they leave feeling part of something bigger."

Last summer, the circles came together for a crochet picnic in Prince Edward County—an afternoon of laughter, shared lunch, and rows of yarn stitched under the open sky. "It felt like one big family reunion," Emebet says. "Except we were meeting each other for the first time."

A Global Effort with Local Roots

Word of the project has travelled far. After a local news story aired, a woman in the United States reached out to Emebet, wanting to contribute. They met over Zoom, shared ideas, and soon, a package of handmade crochet squares was on its way across the border. Contributors from Ethiopia, where Emebet was born, are also now involved.

"It's wild to think about," she says. "This little idea—something I dreamed up on a walk—is bringing people together around the world."

But at its core, Bridging Communities remains deeply rooted in Belleville. Emebet's own backyard—nestled beside a conservation area on the east side of the city—was her first creative refuge when she moved here in 2013. The nature, the people, and the peaceful rhythm of the city gave her space to imagine something new.

"I came here with no job, no plan—just my family and a passion for art," she says. "And I've found so much here. Support, inspiration, community."

Stories Stitched into Every Square

Each crocheted square tells a story. Some are stitched by experienced artists exploring mosaic and intarsia techniques. Others are humble, first-time creations

from students, seniors, or newcomers picking up a hook for the first time. And every piece matters.

"I had a boy in Grade 5 who struggled," Emebet recalls. "He dropped his hook often. He was behind. But he never gave up. Three months later, I saw him crocheting away—and that moment

made my day. That's what this is about."

In another school, a young girl ran up to Emebet, beaming. "I'm teaching my mom to crochet!" It was just weeks after the workshop, and already the project had found its way into homes, building bridges not only between neighbours, but generations.

As of now, the full installation is scheduled to be unveiled in mid-2026, depending on bridge renovations. Emebet hopes the bridge may one day become pedestrian-only, transforming it into a permanent public art and gathering space.

"The idea is to build something lasting—not just in yarn, but in relationships," she says. "When you crochet with someone, you slow down. You talk. You laugh. It's just like sitting with your grandmother or a friend. It's peaceful. It's meaningful."

Get Involved!

Everyone is welcome to participate—whether you're a pro or have never held a hook. You can drop into one of the many crochet circles or request yarn to make squares from home. You can also give materials, sponsor a section, or help spread the word. For more information, visit artwithpassion.ca or follow the project on Facebook and Instagram.

"We're not just wrapping a bridge," Emebet says. "We're wrapping our community in care, inclusion, and creativity. Every stitch brings us closer."


So, go ahead—give it a try. Pull up a chair. Pick up a hook. Whether it's your first stitch or your thousandth, there's a place for you here.

The Tinkered Decor and More Store:

Where Local Creativity Comes to Life in Downtown Belleville

In the heart of Downtown Belleville, *The Tinkered Decor and More Store* is more than just a gift shop—it's a warm and welcoming space where creativity, community, and small business come together. This unique handicraft shop features the work of more than 30 local artisans and small businesses, offering a thoughtful blend of handmade goods, vintage finds, upcycled treasures, and curated gift items. It's also home to a full line of Fusion Mineral Paint, making it a go-to for DIY and décor lovers.

The shop is owned and operated by Jennifer Hunter, a local entrepreneur whose journey into business was driven by a dream. "I started working at the store about three years ago, and a year and a half ago, I took over as the owner," she says. Before owning the store, she was a familiar face at local craft and vendor markets—already deeply connected to the creative community she now supports every day through her business.

Those roots in the local maker community are at the heart of everything *The Tinkered Decor and More Store* stands for. The philosophy is simple but powerful: *support small businesses, support local, and support Canadian*. About 95 percent of the items found in the store are sourced from small businesses, many of them local and all of them Canadian. It's a shop that feels personal, purposeful, and proudly local.



"I've always wanted to have this kind of store," Jennifer says. "It's about creating a space where everyone feels welcome. We treat our customers like long-time friends." That sense of belonging extends beyond the customers to the vendors, too. Over time, many of the artisans whose work fills the shelves have become close friends, forming a tight-knit and supportive creative network.

What inspires Jennifer most isn't just the products—it's the people. "I love the people I meet along the way. Customers and

vendors have become friends. I want every customer to come in, feel welcome, and leave feeling wowed by what they saw and bought and how they were treated." With majority of her time spent representing other people's brands, she sees it as her job to make every customer experience a memorable one.

And her passion for local doesn't end at the store's front door. This summer, Jennifer launched a second seasonal location at *Pop-Ups on the Bay* in West Zwick's Park. The lakeside popup is a smaller version of the main store and offers another opportunity to showcase local talent. It's a beautiful way to bring what we do to the waterfront. "What is better than getting outside and spending time by the Bay of Quinte?" she says.

Outside of running her business, Jennifer is also a wife, mom, and proud paw-rent to three dogs and two cats. Her entrepreneurial spirit continues with her travel business, *The Inspired Wanderer Travel Company*, and she remains deeply involved in the local business community. She serves as a Director with the Downtown Belleville Improvement Area (DBIA) and co-chairs Quinte Women in Business, where she works to support and connect other local entrepreneurs.

Jennifer's message to the community is one of pride and encouragement: "Being a part of Downtown Belleville is a wonderful experience. We have a beautiful downtown core, and I think a lot of locals are missing out. We get tourists in the store frequently telling us how lovely our downtown is and that they feel safe and welcome. If you haven't been downtown in a long time, come down, support local, and check out the



wonderful dining and shopping options."

With its charming atmosphere, ever-changing inventory, and a strong sense of community, *The Tinkered Decor and More Store* is more than a store—it's a reflection of the passion, creativity, and heart that make downtown Belleville shine.



This Month's Recipe

The Canadiana Caprese Salad

By Oliver Kjeldsen

When local tomatoes hit their peak, there's no need to overcomplicate things. This simple salad is all about celebrating what's fresh and in season—from just-picked cherry tomatoes to fragrant backyard basil. Perfect for lazy lunches, patio dinners, or as a side to anything off the grill. For an added touch of Canadian flair, top it off with crispy maple-glazed bacon.

Inaredients

- 1 pint of ripe cherry tomatoes (or local onthe-vine tomatoes, quartered)
- 1 ball of burrata or fresh mozzarella
- A few tablespoons of fresh basil, torn or chopped
- A drizzle of quality olive oil
- Flaky sea salt

Optional Maple Bacon Add-On

2-3 slices of maple bacon, cooked until crisp, then roughly chopped

Pro Tip: Look for locally cured options from your butcher or local farm shop

Instructions

- Place the cheese in the centre of a serving plate or shallow bowl.
- Top generously with the tomatoes.
- Drizzle with olive oil and sprinkle with flaky sea
- Finish with fresh basil.
- Optional: Top with maple bacon crumbles for a sweet-salty crunch that takes it to the next level.
- Serve immediately, on it's own or spooned generously over warm, fresh-baked focaccia - perfect for soaking up every last drop of seasonal goodness!
